Canada!



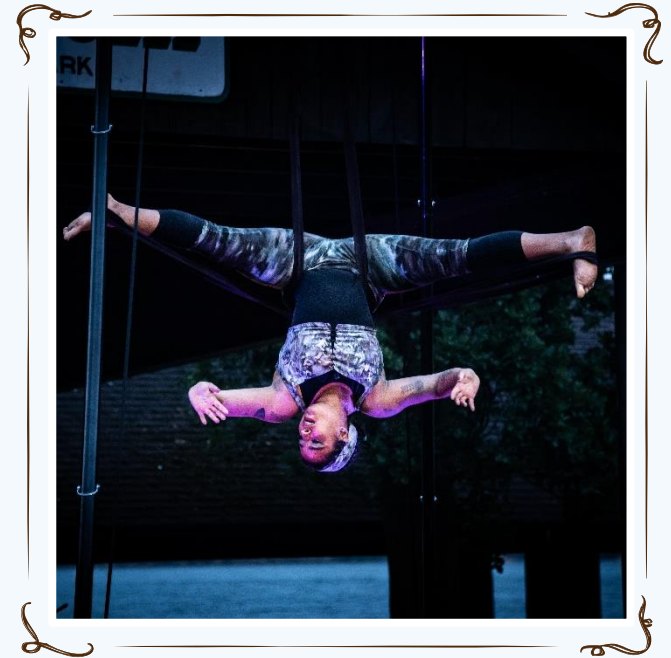
Here are some of the circus artists I may see:
